

# Three Color Bunting

This bunting is a great way to add a splash of color to any room or occasion. Also it is a great way to use up some stash yarn that may or may not be piling up. There are two rows of buntings for this project: a five triangle row, and a three triangle row connected to the top one.

This project requires intermediate knitting knowledge (casting on, knit stitch, purl stitch, binding off, and increasing) and basic crocheting knowledge (chaining and slip stitches), making it a fun and quick project.

## Materials:

Worsted weight yarn in three different colors (written in the pattern as "color A", "color B", and "color C").

Size 10 knitting needles

Size G crochet hook

## To Make:

Cast on 2 sts.

Row 1: [K1,m1] two times.

Row 2 and all even numbered rows: Purl across

Rows 3, 5, 7, 9, 11, and 13: K1, m1, knit to last stitch, k1, m1.

Bind off loosely.

Make 5 triangles with color A, and 3 triangles with color B.

#### Three Triangle Bunting:

With the crochet hook and color C, chain 30, slip stitch across each stitch of a color A triangle.

Chain 10.

Slip stitch across each stitch of a color B triangle.

Chain 10.

Slip stitch across each stitch of a color A triangle.

Chain 30 and cut yarn.

Weave in all ends.

#### Five Triangle Bunting:

With the crochet hook and color C, chain 20, slip stitch across each stitch of a color A triangle

Chain 10.

Slip stitch across each stitch of a color B triangle.

Chain 10.

Slip stitch across each stitch of a color A triangle.

Chain 10.

Slip stitch across each stitch of a color B triangle.

Chain 10.

Slip stitch across each stitch of a color A triangle.

Chain 20, cut yarn.

Weave in all ends.

Tie or sew the smaller bunting to the outside corner of the first and last triangle of the larger bunting. Hang and enjoy!
